 - b. <u>Policy 5122</u>: Assignment of Students To Classes: Defines more clearly and accurately the criteria for the assignment of students to classes. Updates support the alignment with <u>PA 21-199</u>, § 3, Advanced Course Enrollment.
 - c. <u>Policy 6146.1</u>: Grading/Assessment Systems: Weighted Grades: Addresses updates and defines practices in accordance with <u>PA 21-199</u>, § 3, Advanced Course Enrollment and Public Act 21-2, Automatic Admissions Program Eligibility, on:

 - ii. Calculation of GPA Using a Weighted Grades System and Mastery learning

 - g. Future Policy Committee Items for Review:
 - i. 6172.1 Gifted and Talented Students Program: Not later than July 1, 2022, each local and regional board of education shall adopt a policy for the equitable identification of gifted and talented students. Such policy shall require the use of multiple methods of identification of gifted and talented students that are in compliance with guidance provided by the Department of Education.
 - ii. Policy 6146.12: Challenging Curriculum Policy: (On hold until guidance from State Department of Education and CABE). (a) Not later than July 1, 2022, each local and regional board of education shall adopt a challenging curriculum policy. A challenging curriculum policy shall include, but need not be limited to, (1) criteria for the identification of students in grades eight and nine who may be eligible to take or enroll in an advanced course or program, as defined in section 3 of this act, and (2) a provision requiring the creation of an academic plan, in accordance with the provisions of subsection (b) of this section.
